Fall 2022 – Spring 2023 Cohort**

Upon graduation, 96% of the teacher education completers (n=41) received employment in the educational field, mission field, or attended graduate school: 80% employment and 17% graduate school. The completers who sought employment were employed within the first 6th month of graduating from Ouachita Baptist University. The additional 2% of teacher education completers sought other professional and/or personal pursuits. There were 21 completers working in Arkansas P-12 Public and Private Schools. There were 9 completers working in surrounding states/overseas: Missouri, Ohio, Oklahoma, Texas, and Asia.

Fall 2021 – Spring 2022 Cohort**

Upon graduation, 98% of the teacher education completers (n=40) received employment in the educational field or attended graduate school: 90% employment and 10% graduate school. The completers who sought employment were employed within the first 6th month of graduating from Ouachita Baptist University. The additional 2% of teacher education completers sought other professional and/or personal pursuits. There were 26 completers working in Arkansas P-12 Public and Private Schools. There were 11 completers hired in an AR Title I school and 9 completers hired at EPP partner schools. There were 9 completers working in surrounding states: Missouri, Ohio, Oklahoma, and Texas.

Fall 2020 – Spring 2021 Cohort**

Upon graduation, 95% of the teacher education completers (n=39) received employment in the educational field or attended graduate school: 97% employment and 3% graduate school. There were 27 completers who were hired in Arkansas public schools, 1 completer in AR private school, and 8 completers in other states (Kansas, Oklahoma, and Texas). There were 20 completers hired in an AR Title I school and 15 completers hired at EPP partner schools. District subject-area and grade-level needs that they serve include: 12 elementary, 8 middle school, 2 secondary Biology, 1 secondary mathematics, 2 secondary English, 8 fine arts, 2 secondary history, and 3 physical education

## **Completers Employment Data Fall 2019 – Spring 2020 Cohort**

Upon graduation, 94% of the teacher education completers (n=31) received employment in the educational field or attended graduate school: 84% employment and 10% graduate school. The completers who sought employment were employed within the first 6<sup>th</sup> month of graduating from Ouachita Baptist University. The additional 6% of teacher education completers sought other professional and/or personal pursuits.

Of the 26 completers who receive employment in the educational field, 17 completers were hired in elementary schools, 1 completer in middle school, 7 completers in high school, and 1 completer in K-12 setting. There were 10 completers working in Arkansas P-12 Public and Private Schools. There were 16 completers working in surrounding states: Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas.

## **Ouachita Baptist University Completers Employment Data Fall 2018 – Spring 2019 Cohort**

Upon graduation, 94% of the teacher education completers (n=36) received employment in the educational field or attended graduate school: 89% employment and 6% graduate school. The completers who sought employment were employed within the first 6<sup>th</sup> month of graduating from Ouachita Baptist University. The additional 3% of teacher education completers sought other professional and/or personal pursuits.

Of the 32 completers who receive employment in the educational field, 18 completers were hired in elementary schools, 7 completers in middle school, and 7 completers in high school. There were 19 completers working in Arkansas P-12 Public and Private Schools.

## **Ouachita Baptist University Completers Employment Data Fall 2017 – Spring 2018 Cohort**

Upon graduation, 92% of the teacher education completers (n=24) received employment in the educational field or attended graduate school: 83% employment and 8% graduate school. The completers who sought employment were employed within the first 6<sup>th</sup> month of graduating from Ouachita Baptist University. The additional 8% of teacher education completers sought other professional and/or personal pursuits.

Of the 20 completers who receive employment in the educational field, 10 completers were hired in elementary schools, 5 completers in middle school, and 5 completers in high school. There were 15 completers working in Arkansas P-12 Public and Private Schools.

Upon graduation, 100% of the teacher education completers (n=31) received employment in the educational field or attended graduate school: 90% employment and 10% graduate school. Of the 28 completers who receive employment in the educational field, 16 completers were hired in elementary schools, 9 completers in middle school, and 3 completers in high school. There were 20 completers working in Arkansas P-12 Public and Private Schools.

Upon graduation, 82% of the teacher education completers (n=33) received employment in the educational field or attended graduate school: 76% employment and 6% graduate school. The completers who sought employment were employed within the first 6<sup>th</sup> month of graduating from Ouachita Baptist University. The additional 18% of teacher education completers sought other professional and/or personal pursuits.

Of the 25 completers who receive employment in the educational field, 15 completers were hired in elementary schools, 5 completers in middle school, and 5 completers in high school. There were 17 completers working in Arkansas P-12 Public and Private Schools.
