Scope and Contents and Arrangement

This collection contains photocopied materials compiled by Hazel Guyol between 1987 and 1991 relating to the U.S. reparations to Japanese Americans interned following the 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor, as well as Japanese foreign-domestic relations following the war. Topics include Americans for Historical Accuracy publications, correspondence, and summaries and copies of H.R. 442, the Civil Liberties Act. It also contains publications from the *New York Times* about Americans of Japanese descent. Other materials include advertisements, award certificates, commentaries, and publications about post-WWII historical revisionism.

Biographical summary

Hazel Sample Guyol was born on 10 February 1910 in El Dorado, Arkansas, to Lavelle and Fannie Belle Murphy Sample. She began her career as a teacher in 1931 following her graduation from Ouachita Baptist College (now Ouachita Baptist University). She taught in Ohio, Tennessee, New Hampshire, and Michigan, later pursuing a master's degree at The Ohio State University. She became a member of the South Arkansas Historical Society and, following her retirement, began writing articles for the *New York Tribune*, *Arkansas Gazette*, *Arkadelphia Siftings-Herald*, *El Dorado News-Times*, and *Pine Bluff*

Commercial. She was best known for her writings on Japanese Americans, Pearl Harbor, World War II, and for her 1995 book *Wrecking Crews-Salvage Squad*.

Hazel Sample was married to Philip Nelson Guyol (1905-1996) and they had two children, Deborah and Nicholas. She passed away on June 14, 2005.
