INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AND MKs INVOLVED IN EVERY ASPECT OF LIFE AT OUACHITA

Ouachita is currently home to roughly 40 international students and 20 children of cross-cultural missionaries. The Grant Center is proud of the strong diversity present among this group, with 30 different countries being represented. We are also proud that this group of students is heavily invested across campus.

This spring, five of our international student athletes were honored for their exceptional grades and athleticism by being named to the elite All-Ouachita athletic or academic teams.

During the annual Academic Awards Banguet, six international students and missionary kids were honored.

On Scholar's Day at Ouachita, eight of our students were involved in 10 different presentations.

Our international students are members of five of the 14 NCAA Division 2 athletics teams at Ouachita.

Some are serving on the Tiger Serve Day leadership team and others as resident assistants and assistant resident directors. Others are performing in Ouachita's talented choirs and bands.

Their art is on display in the galleries, and they're making Ouachita proud by competing well in ENACTUS and helping to manage the Ary Investment Fund with the Hickingbotham School of Business. They are serving with the Ouachita Student Foundation to raise money for student scholarships.

Some volunteer for Backyard Bible Club and YoungLife, participate in trips led by Campus Ministries and invest in local churches.

This fall, eight international students made the President's List (GPA of 4.0) and 11 made the Dean's List (GPA of 3.6 or higher). This spring, nine international students made the President's List and six made the Dean's List. This means at least half of our international students have held a GPA of 3.6 or higher for the past academic year!

By their presence on our campus, our international students and TCKs (third culture kids) are bringing the world to Ouachita, and through their friendships, they are providing the chance for our American students to experience different worldviews.

Our international students and TCKs are an invaluable resource to Ouachita, and we are proud that such an outstanding group of students call Ouachita "home."

INTERNATIONAL FOOD FESTIVAL

The International Food Festival was held Feb. 21 in Walker Conference Center. This vear, the Grant Center and International Club partnered with Campus Ministries and Residence Life to focus on the global refugee crisis. Donations for "welcome kits" were gathered in the residence halls and at IFF and then distributed through Campus Ministries' Spring Break trips focused on working with refugees in Memphis and California. During the entertainment, attendees were able to hear from a Syrianborn pastor serving in Atlanta about the impact that believers can have in welcoming refugees. It was a special time to work together across campus and raise awareness of opportunities to serve globally that can occur very close to home.
